Indian Monuments


Ayaan, Rohan and Tina were friends. They enjoyed going to school and learning.

Story in Time

The place is said to have been discovered by Frank Smythe, a British mountaineer. In 1931, he lost his way while returning from a successful expedition to Mt. Kamet and he reached this valley, bordered by snow-capped mountain ranges and carpet of flowers. The valley was blooming with about 500 species of flowers. He was so attracted to the beauty of the place that he named it 'Valley of Flowers'. He authored a book called 'The Valley of Flowers' which unveiled the beauty and floral splendours of the valley and thus, threw open the doors of this verdant jewel to nature-enthusiasts all over the world.

Did You Know: Valley of Flowers

- According to legends, the region was earlier known as 'Nandan Kanan', or the 'Garden of Lord Indra', the King of Gods.
- During its early phase, the Park was locally known as Bhyundar Valley and was unknown to the world for centuries. However, the locals always knew of the existence of the valley and believed that it was inhabited by fairies.
- According to the epic Ramayana, it is believed that this is the place where Lord Hanuman searched for the Sanjeevani herbs to cure Lakshmana, when he was injured by Indrajit (Meghnad), son of demon king Ravana.
- More than 650 species of flowers are found here. Most of them have medicinal value.

- 'Arjuna's Penance', also known as 'Descent of the Ganges', is a detailed sculpture carved on a huge rock.
- It portrays the scene from the Mahabharata, where Arjuna gets the ultimate weapon called 'Pasupata' from Lord Shiva, by meditating while standing on one leg.
- It is also believed that this sculpture depicts the meditation of King Bhagiratha to bring the River Ganga to Earth, with the help of Lord Shiva.
- 'Krishna's Butter Ball' is a huge ball-shaped, granite rock which is situated on the edge of a steep slope in Mahabalipuram.
- It is famous for being in the same position for over a thousand years, without rolling down.
- Over the years, many attempts have been made to move the rock, but none have been successful.

Did You Know: Mahabalipuram

- Mahabalipuram is also known as 'Mamallapuram', after the Pallava King Narasimhavarman I, who was known as 'Mamalla', meaning 'the great wrestler'.
- Mahabalipuram is a famous tourist spot that has beautiful temple architecture and Pallava art.
- Of the Pancha Rathas, the ratha dedicated to Yudhisthira, the eldest Pandava, is the largest one and the ratha dedicated to Draupadi is the smallest and is shaped like a hut.
- 'Krishna's Butter Ball' gets its name from the belief that it is a butter ball which fell from the sky when Lord Krishna was stealing it from a pot.
- Mahabalipuram sculptures and temples are a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Pagodas
Pagodas are temple domes that have multiple tiers. It is a very popular element in Chinese architecture. In Mahabalipuram, the Shore Temple dome is called a 'pagoda'. According to legends, there were originally seven pagodas in Mahabalipuram, out of which six were washed away by the sea, leaving only one.



The note ended with a sharp question, "O almighty King, who then is more cursed – I or you?" The King realised what Ramaya meant and set him free.
