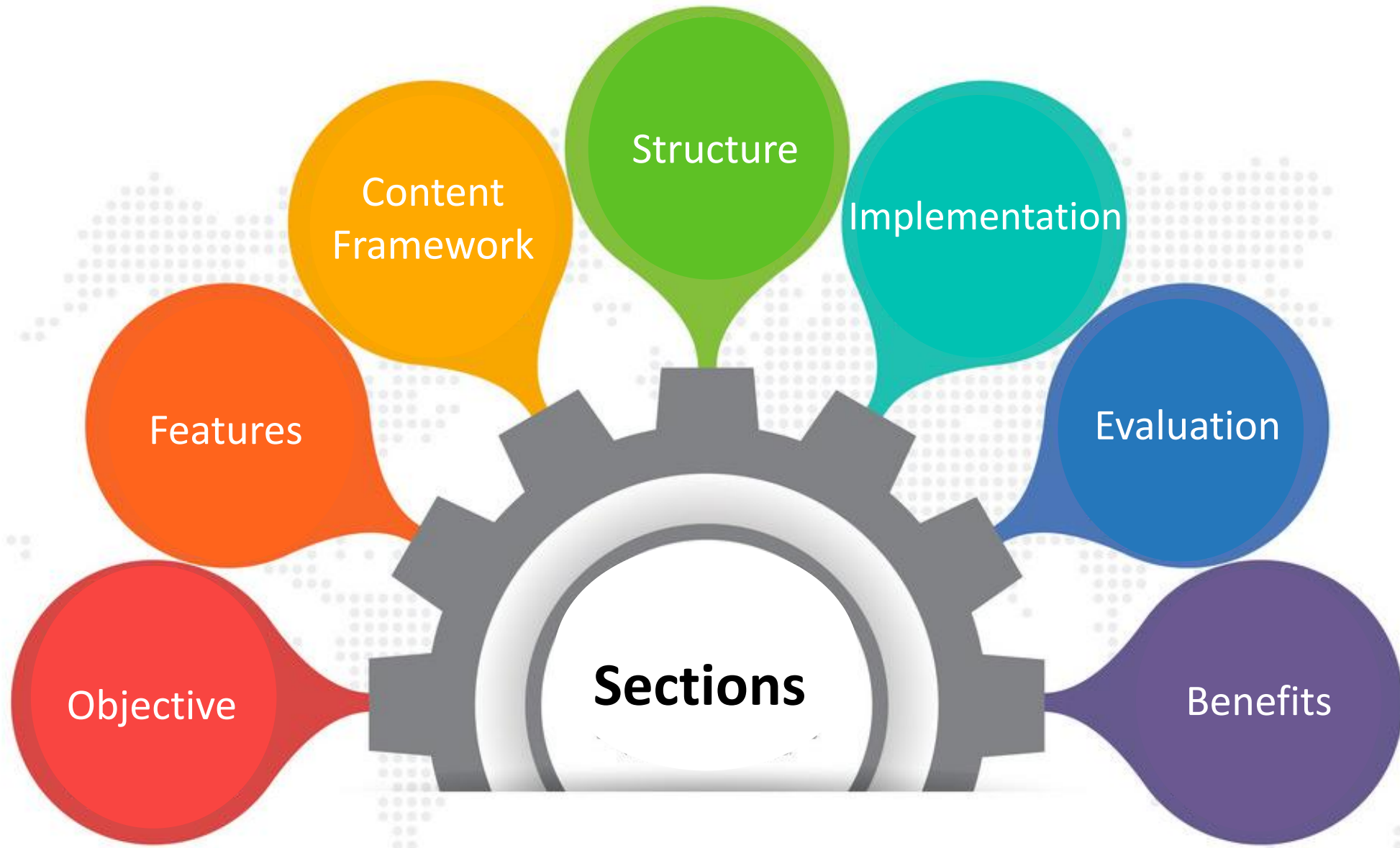

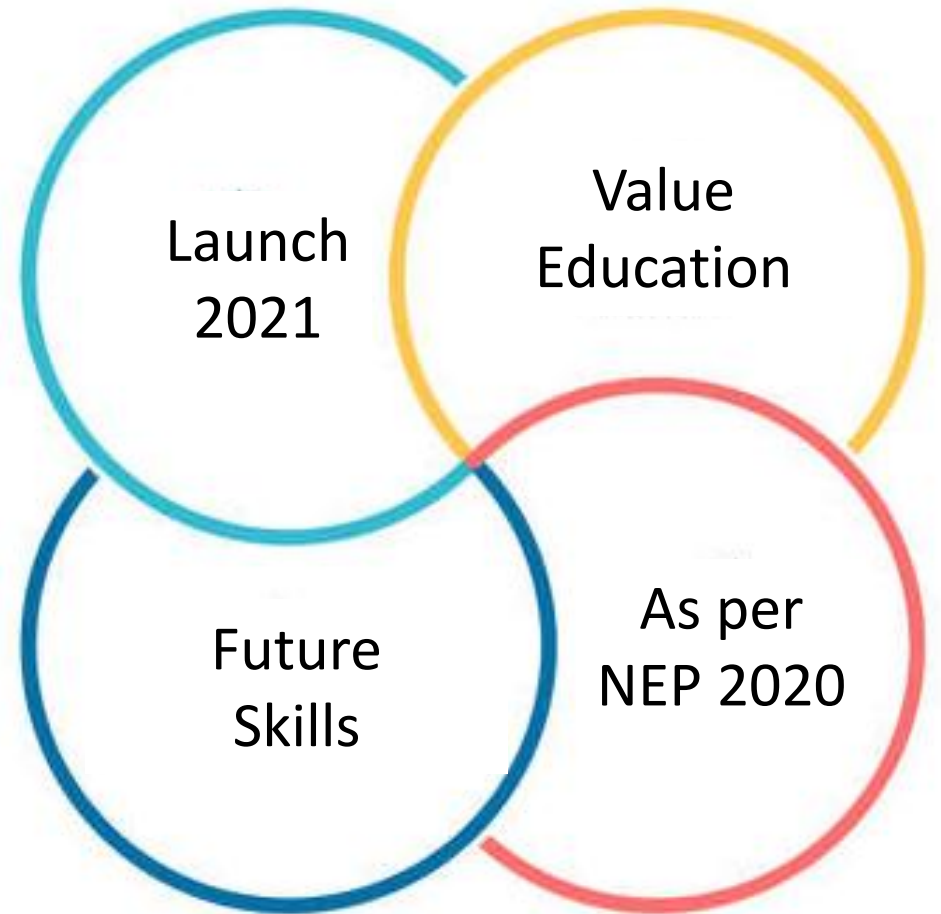

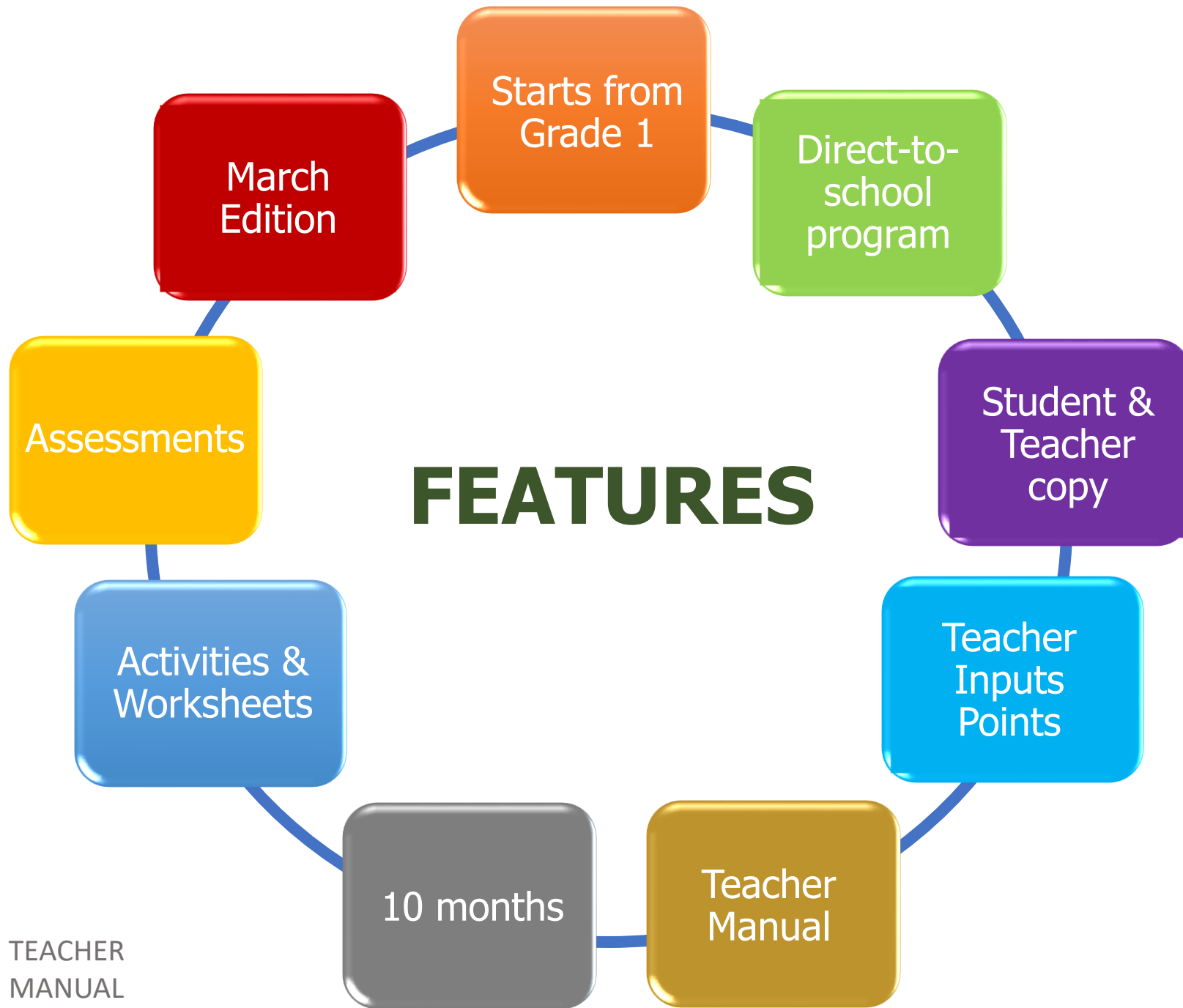
**Stepping Stones (SS)** is a **NEP 2020 compliant** holistic value education and future skills program.

# What are the key objectives of SS?

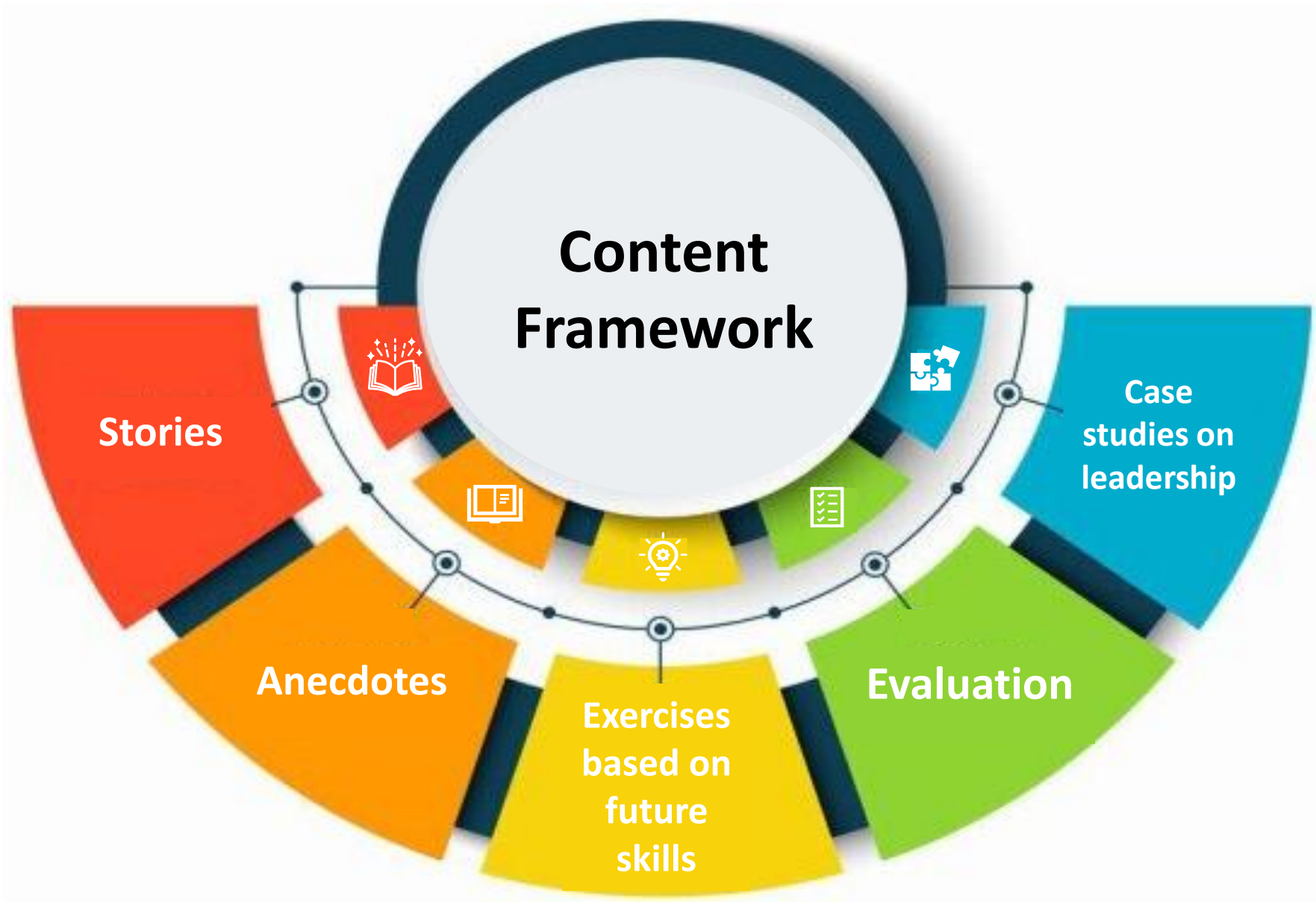






- ✓ The program is spread across 10 months.

Lal Bahadur Shastri was a politician and a freedom fighter who fought against the British rule in India. He was the second Prime Minister of independent India. There have been many instances where he has displayed integrity throughout his life. Here are some examples.

During the freedom struggle, Lal Bahadur Shastri was imprisoned\* at the Faizabad prison. His wife went to meet him, carrying some fruits without anyone noticing. When Lal Bahadur Shastri got to know about this, he was angry and he refused to accept the fruits because prisoners were not allowed to have anything other than the food provided in the prison.

In another instance, Lal Bahadur Shastri had to take a flight to Delhi from Kolkata. The evening traffic made it impossible for him to reach the airport on time. The police came up with an idea and decided to send a car with a siren ahead of Lal Bahadur Shastri's car, to make way for him in the traffic. Hearing this idea, he firmly refused as he did not want to cause the general public any inconvenience just because he had to reach the airport on time.

When Lal Bahadur Shastri became the Prime Minister, the government had given him a car and a driver for his official activities. One day, when his family had to use the driver for some personal work, Lal Bahadur Shastri asked the driver to make a note of the distance travelled and told his wife to pay for the same.

Despite being in power, Lal Bahadur Shastri remained humble and honest in his actions.

In 1965, when India was facing a shortage of food, Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri told his family that they would give up on the evening meal. Only after observing how that worked for him and his family, he requested the people in the country to sacrifice one meal at least once a week, to help with the food shortage in the country.

Lal Bahadur Shastri is still remembered for his integrity. All these instances from his life prove that integrity can take us to great heights.

Lal Bahadur Shastri lived his entire life being honest and responsible. Integrity is when we live a life of honesty, fairness and responsibility. It shows others who we really are.

Jehangir Ratanji Dadabhoy Tata (J. R. D. Tata) was a pioneer aviator and built one of the largest industrial houses of India. He is credited with placing the Tata Group on the international map.  
Air Marshal Aspy Merwan Engineer won the Aga Khan trophy for being the first Indian to fly from London to Delhi. At only 17, he was the youngest Indian pilot of that time. He was trained at Royal Air Force (RAF) Cranwell, where he was adjudged the best all-round cadet.

#### Teacher Input Points (TIPS):

You could get into a discussion with the class by asking them the following questions:

1. What would have happened if J. R. D. Tata had decided not to help Aspy?
2. Have you ever helped your competitor out in a situation?
3. What can we learn from the situation?  
*Fair play is a commitment to take part in good spirit and with a good attitude, which includes: respect, modesty, friendship and equality*
4. Who comes to you mind when you think of fair play? Name three people who you know or have heard of and support your answers with reasons.



**Teacher Input Points (TIPS)**

You could get into a discussion with the class by asking them the following questions:

1. What did Arun notice when he looked at the spelling words and compared the same with his answer sheet?  
He had spelt 'phase' wrong.
2. What lesson did the class learn from Arun?  
A lesson on being honest
3. What does honesty mean to you?  
Being honest doesn't just mean to 'not lie', it also means saying and doing things that are truthful. An action is not honest when:
  - a. We are saying something that is not true
  - b. We are holding from saying the truth
  - c. We are doing something that is morally wrong
4. What would you have done if you were in Arun's place?
5. Have you ever been in situations where you have owned up and been honest?  
This could be numerous instances of owing up to something one has done or not done. For example, owing up to breaking a glass at home while playing, owing up to the teacher for not having done the homework, etc.

Teacher Input Points (TIPS)

**Additional questions for discussion**

1. What do you think it means to 'lie'?
2. What are some things that people lie about? What are the things that you usually lie about?
3. How can you lie without saying anything at all?

8. You register for an online game whose rules state that you must be 12 years old to play.

Exit from the game or talk to your parents about it.
